WECHS STUDENT SELECTED FOR GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL

WECHS junior Edgar Arrieta-Reyes will represent Warren County at Governor's School of North Carolina this



summer. The son of Jose Arieta and Simona Reyes of Warrenton, he was selected in the subject of English. Arrieta-Reyes will be participating in the program from June 18-July 26 at Salem College in Winston-Salem. Governor's School provides intellectually gifted students who are

rising seniors in high school the opportunity to spend fiveand one-half weeks on a college campus studying the most recent ideas and concepts of the academic discipline in which they are selected without credit, tests, or grades. The program is administered by the Public Schools of North Carolina, the State Board of Education and the Department of Public Instruction through the Exceptional Children's Division. Student must complete an application that includes two essays in order to be considered. Arrieta-Reyes said that he about his selection into the program a couple of weeks ago.

His primary focus during Governor's School will be English classes, but he noted that participants will have an

opportunity to take other courses, such as religious studies or martial arts. The session will be a busy time for students with days filled with seminars combined with some free time. Arrieta-Reyes is looking forward to spending time on a college campus.

"It's a taste of college life," he said. "Classes will help me learn something new and grow as a person." The junior maintains a busy schedule as a Warren Early College student. He has played soccer each year since middle school and is a member of the Beta Club and has been active with the group's community outreach efforts. Last summer, Arrieta-Reyes took college classes through Vance-Granville Community College, and he plans to take online courses this summer while he is at Governor's School.

Striving for academic excellence is nothing new for Arrieta-Reyes. He has scored a score of 26 out of 36 on the ACT college entrance exam, but plans to retake it to see if he can achieve a higher score.

Warren Early College allows students to earn a college associate's degree and high school diploma at the same time. Arrieta-Reyes is thinking about continuing his education at N.C. State University in Raleigh, majoring in political science and minoring in technology or textile design.

Warren Early College Principal Tracey Neal described Arrieta-Reyes as a well-rounded student who excels academically while undertaking a number of other school responsibilities, such as student ambassador and tutor. "I am so excited that he received this acceptance (to Governor's School) because he is such a deserving student", she said.
