

Warren New Tech High School (WNTHS) opened in 2007 in conjunction with the North Carolina New Schools Project and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. WNTHS is also part of the STEM schools network (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics). WNTHS is one of on hundred schools in the New Technology Network, based in Napa, California. In 2009, New Tech Foundation partnered with Knowledge Works, creating our New Tech Network. In 2007, WNTHS admitted the first ninth grade class. This original ninth grade class will be graduating this year



making, WNTHS a full scale high school with grades nine through twelve, holding its first graduation in May 2011.

Project Based Learning

Project Based Learning, (PBL) is an effective learning model that is founded on the principle that, "learning is partly a social activity."

Students at WNTHS learn curriculum material through the completion of several projects throughout the year. Through the core projects, students are learning to solve problems by beginning with the end in mind.

They are completely aligned with NCSCOS. Classes at New Tech are student-directed with teachers as facilitators rather than lecturers. It begins with an entry document highlighting the tasks, the learning that will be discovered, and end with a presentation before a panel professionals from the community.
